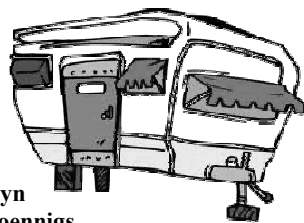

Who's Who

Michael Curtis (Chorus) Michael was last seen by Coach House audiences as Nicky in *Bell, Book and Candle* and Allan in *Play It Again, Sam*. He has been a member of Coach House since 2001. Favorite roles include Dr. Sanderson in *Harvey*, Captain Hasting in *Black Coffee*, Francis Nurse in *The Crucible* and both Bill Bibbit and Frank Scanlon in *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*.

Rachel Davis (Tanya) Rachel appeared as Constable Thompkins in *Murdered to Death* and as Hope Langdon in *Something's Afoot*, and participated in the 4th and 5th Annual Variety Shows. She was assistant director in Coach House Players' *Nana's Naughty Knickers*.
