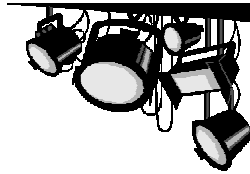

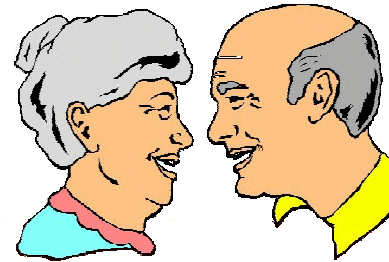

Who's Who (in alphabetical order)

Adam Alberts (Dr. Arthur Morse) Born, raised, and residing in Kingston, Adam has appeared in several productions with Coach House Players, most recently as the pub owner in the last two **Annual Variety Shows**. He's been with Coach House since 2007, and also been on stage with Phoenicia's Shandaken Theatrical Society. On film, Adam has appeared on the big screen in movie theaters from Albany to New York City, and on television in productions with FOX, ABC, and PBS. Adam loves entertaining the wonderful folks of his hometown Hudson Valley -- not only on stage, but also as a Music DJ and Programming Producer with 1490-WKNY Radio in Kingston.

Rachel Davis (Eleanor Curtis) Rachel last appeared as Constable Thompkins in *Death by Fatal Murder* reviving the role from *Murdered to Death*. She also appeared with Coach House Players in *Secondary Cause of Death*, *Over the River and Through the Woods*, *Lust 'n Rust: The Trailer Park Musical* and *Something's Afoot*. She was musical director for *They're Playing Our Song* and assistant director for *Nana's Naughty Knickers* and participated in a few **Annual Variety Shows**. Rachel now serves on the board of Coach House Players. She is a past recipient of the annual Coach House Scholarship, and went on to study music at The Crane School of Music in Potsdam, NY. She enjoys participating in all Coach House productions and loves her "Coach House Family."

Bernadette Pikul (Cynthia Morse) Bernadette is delighted to be making her CHP onstage debut and working with such a talented cast and crew and is grateful to John (Director) and Sue (Assistant Director) for all their guidance and support. About the playwright: **Henry Denker**, was a lawyer and member of the New York bar before becoming a writer. He was married for 61 years to Edith Heckman, whom he met when he was a patient and she was a nurse in Mt. Sinai Hospital in New York City. His writing included nine stage plays, six of which have been produced on Broadway (including this one); twenty-five screen plays (movie & TV); and, thirty-seven novels.

Tom Roberts (Bruce Morse) Tom was previously in Tennessee Williams' *A Streetcar Named Desire* performed at The Center for Performing Arts at Rhinebeck by Up In One Productions. This is his first appearance with Coach House Players. He would like to thank John for this opportunity and he looks forward to many more in the future.

Rob Rowe (Mike Curtis) Rob studied at Blue Horse Repertory Co. with acting coach Lora Lee Ecobelli for 2 years. He has performed in stage presentations of Tennessee Williams; *The Lady of Larkspur Lotion*, playing The Writer, Anton Chekhov's; *The Boor*, playing Grigory Stepanovich Smirnov, John Cariani's; *Almost Maine*, playing Lendall, Chad & Dave, and most recently John Steinbeck's; *Of Mice and Men*, playing Slim. He has also appeared in several upstate independent films. He's looking forward to performing with the Coach House Players for the first time.

Barbara Surowitz (Laura Curtis) Barbara has been active with Coach House Players both backstage and onstage. Her favorite roles were the quintessential Jewish mother in *Come Blow Your Horn* and the neurotic daughter in *Social Security*. She was last seen as Margaret Craddock in the Coach House production of *Murdered to Death*. It was Barbara's 40th show with Coach House. Barbara is also a member of Coach House Players' Board of Directors and serves as the Membership Secretary.

John Thayer (Director) John has been a member of Coach House since 1987 when he was in the cast of *Anything Goes*. Since then, he has appeared in more than 35 shows, most recently in *They're Playing Our Song* and has directed two others for CHP. John has also appeared with several other local theater groups. John's love of music has led him to write several unpublished songs for various occasions. John and his wife, Mary, are the proud parents of Kelly and Jenny, and have a beautiful granddaughter, Bailey.
